*College Success for Beginners* Oct 25 2020 When researchers talk about college access, there's no question which issues they're discussing, nor is there any lack of data to grapple with. But when it comes to a related topic -- success once students make it to college -- it's not as clear what policy makers are referring to, or even if the term itself is meaningful. What is "college success"? A group of presidents and administrators grappled with the question on Monday at a panel assembled to coincide with the release of a new book, *College Success: What It Means and How to Make It Happen*, published this week by the College Board. Juan Williams of National Public Radio moderated the discussion, which featured the anthology's editors, Michael S. McPherson and Morton Owen Schapiro; the president of Miami Dade College's Homestead campus, Jeanne Jacobs; and Linda M. Clement, vice president for student affairs at the University of Maryland at College Park. Defining college success is a problem in the first place, agree the book's authors, because institutions of higher learning are so diverse, in terms not only of size, mission and location, but of the types of students who enroll and of their goals once they graduate. And unlike college access issues, looking at success in and after college requires statistics that in many cases don't exist -- or metrics whose utility may be disputed. "What college success means depends so much on what [kind of] college you're talking about and what students you're talking about," said McPherson, who is president of the Spencer Foundation and former president of Macalester College. He suggested that the best measures for college success would be specific but tailored to individual institutions. What that means, precisely, "each one can answer that question for themselves," he said.

**Local Family Connection and Support Through the First Semester of College** Dec 07 2021  
The transition process from high school to college can be filled with many rewards and challenges not only for students, but also for their families. As institutions have continued to evolve to support student success and retention, many universities have added or expanded parent and family program offices. While universities continue to work collaboratively with families promote student success, it is important to understand the how the needs of families may vary. One area to explore is the proximity of students to their family members and how distance may impact the transition for both students and families. A perceived problem in this study was that family members of local students were not as engaged as family members who lived outside the local area. The purpose of this action research study was to better understand and enhance the experience of local families as their students transitioned from high school to college. The study and innovation were grounded in two theoretical frameworks: funds of knowledge and Schlossberg's transition theory. The innovation developed based upon learnings from these theoretical frameworks included four elements: (a) a family guide, (b) family newsletters, (c) an online family video series, and (d) an updated parent and family website. The study was a

mixed methods action research study conducted over the course of one semester. Quantitative data was collected through the use of a presurvey at the start of the academic year and a postsurvey as the semester completed. Qualitative data was collected through individual interviews with local family members. The results of this study indicated that families who participated in at least one element of the innovation reported more knowledge of campus resources, felt more supported by the institution, and were confident in their ability to assist their student in the transition to college. Additionally, implications for practice and areas for future research were explored.
